I can identify all the words that make up noun phrases.

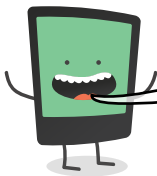

Sometimes it can be tricky to identify all the words that make up a noun phrase. Replacing the noun phrase with pronouns can help us test whether we've identified the correct words; if the new sentences makes sense, we probably have.  
Look at this example.
