

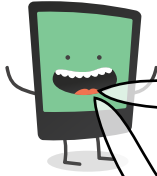

A progressive verb describes something that is in progress, ongoing or incomplete. It hasn't been finished. Progressive verbs are made up of two or more words and one of these word ends in **-ing**.

They were exploring the cave.

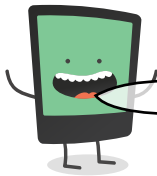
Paul was jumping.
