Perfect verbs can be written in the past perfect, present perfect or future perfect forms. The form of the verb 'to have' tells us which it is. Take a look.

Past perfect

Ben **had** visited his friends.

Present perfect

Ben **has** visited his friends.

Ben and Sally **have** visited their friends.

Future perfect

Ben **will have** visited his friends.

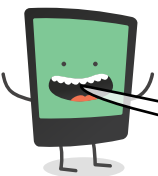
