

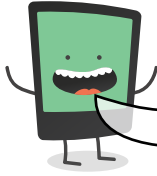

I can ride a bicycle.

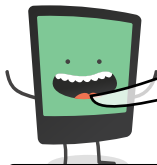
Sally was excited as she knew she could win the prize.
