



I know when to use commas in lists of adjectives.



We can use more than one adjective to describe a single noun. When doing this, sometimes we need to link them with commas and sometimes we don't. Take a look at the rules below.

If the **adjectives come before** the noun and we can **change the order** of the adjectives, we do add a comma. We also break the rule of using 'and' between the last two items.

Hamsters are <u>calm</u>, <u>cuddly</u> pets.

Hamsters are <u>cuddly</u>, <u>calm</u> pets.
