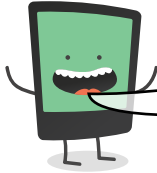

I can use bullet points to punctuate lists.

Bullet points are small dots that can be placed before items in a list. Take a look at the example below which shows how some of our 'rules' are broken with bulleted lists.

We don't need a main clause before the colon, so long as it's a bulleted list.

Shopping list:

- bread
- milk
- cheese

We don't need to end with a full stop.

We don't need 'and' before the final item.



Use these rules to rewrite each list with bullet points. Remember, you can shorten the main clause that comes before the list if you want to.

There will be four friends at my party: Ben, Sally, Beth and Paul.

The school offers three after-school clubs: cricket, art and singing.

The experiment requires four pieces of equipment: scissors, measuring jug, thermometer and scales.
